2018/2019 Undergraduate/Graduate Student Scholarship

General Information

On October 3, 2003, the Southern Illinois Park and Recreation Association (SIPRA) established and funded an educational grant/scholarship program designed to assist individuals who wish to further their educational endeavors. In October of 2008 SIPRA established the "Otto Rice Memorial" scholarship honoring a fellow park and recreation professional that died unexpectedly leaving a legacy of professional commitment to the Community Public Park and Recreation Profession. In January of 2017 SIPRA rededicated its scholarship program as the "H. George Whitehead Scholarship who passed in March, 2016.

Annually hereafter, once the money has been earmarked and set aside, and whenever a sufficient number of qualified applications have been received, two scholarships of \$1,000.00 each shall be **awarded to undergraduate (juniors/seniors) or graduate students enrolled in a four year university level recreation, sport management, forestry, or outdoor education curriculum.**

Payment of the awards will be made in the summer of 2018.

<u>Eligibility</u>

Student scholarship applicant must:

- Have an academic and professional interest in the area of park, recreation, conservation, therapeutic recreation or other community based leisure services such as park districts, park and recreation departments and special recreation associations.
- Be in attendance or show proof of registration at a four year university-level park, recreation, sport management, forestry, outdoor education, or leisure studies curriculum.
- Have a minimum overall 2.5 out of a 4.0 grade point average for all courses of study.
- Have a minimum 3.25 grade point average out of a 4.0 scale in their required recreation major courses of study.

Award Criteria

Applicants will be judged on academic achievement, related professional experiences, leadership, and demonstration of professional involvement.

Application Process

- 1. Complete the application form using word processing. (no hand written applications)
- 2. Sign and date the application.
- 3. Obtain academic advisor signature on application and submit official university transcript with application.
